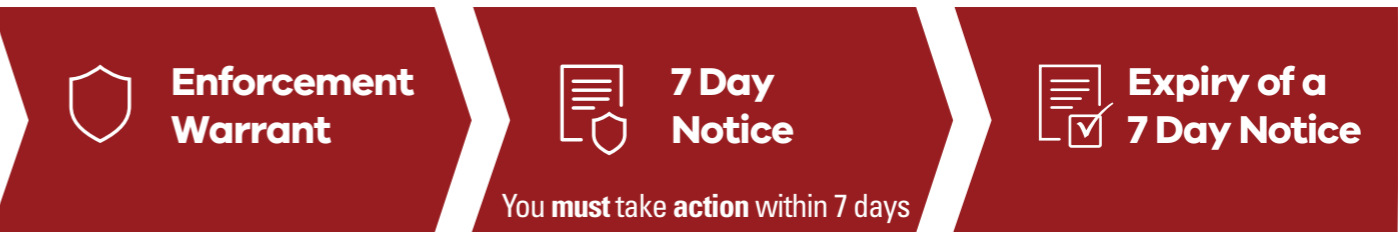

## Your options available during the 3 stages of the fines lifecycle



**You can no longer nominate** the person responsible once your fine reaches the Enforcement or Warrant stage.

**You can no longer request to take the matter to Court** once your fine reaches the Enforcement or Warrant stage.

If a 7 Day Notice expires, your only option is to pay.

If you can't pay, the **Sheriff** can:

- Seize your goods
- Sell your goods at a public auction
- Arrest you

If you are **arrested**, you may be able to undertake **community work**, or you will be bailed to appear in court.

<sup>1</sup> These are minimum statutory requirements. In practice, these timeframes may be longer, depending on if/when an enforcement agency registers a fine, and if /when the Director, Fines Victoria applies for an enforcement warrant.

<sup>2</sup> Enforcement agency includes government agencies, councils, education and health organisations.
