NAMES BASED ON ABORIGINAL WORDS

(Official advice sought and received from the Traditional Owners for Korumburra - they do not approve of aboriginal words going up against other words in community voting. These names have been suggested by others in the community)

Djeembana	Council would need to seek approval from the traditional owner's to consider this suggestion Djeembana - Boon Wurung language for a gathering place for many special occasions.
Karrakkarrak Place	Karrakkarrak Place (alternative name for blowfly - Korumburra also means this)
Thurung Place	Thurung Place (meaning Tiger Snake - a name given to the eastern tribes of Bunurong)
Wahn/Waang Place	Wahn/Waang Place (after the crow spirit in Bunurong mythology, counterpart to Bunjil)
Yaama	Aboriginal word for 'hello Burra' - if this was short listed it would need to be approved by Traditional owners
