This not a true reflection of what is occurring as summer visitors are the worst for littering. A summer anti-littering campaign in several languages should (in my view) be the highest priority.

Public toilets	Venus Bay	Yes		Provided there is a summer anti-littering, visitor education campaign in several languages as mentioned above.
Footpaths and bike paths	Venus Bay	yes		Bike paths and foot paths need better planning and more funding at Venus Bay.

	and enjoy. They are also of high importance for residents. The preservation of natural assets (native bushland, wildlife, public open spaces, natural areas of foreshore and beautiful beaches) of Venus Bay should be a high priority for all managers.
	I am disappointed that the impacts of soiling and littering on beach dunes is not given higher priority in this report. It is marked as LOW priority for Parks Vic and therefore unlikely to be addressed in a climate of reduced funding. Soiling and littering of the beach dunes is a significant public health issue and in my opinion should be given HIGH priority.



#### Dear sir/ms..

Firstly I must congratulate the council for moving forward to address this and the issues arising.. No easy task and lots of challenges to satisfy the many stakeholders and work within the budget restraints.

I have reviewed the document and in particular the elements to relate to Venus Bay.. I have one submission to make.

Town issues action plan - Venus Bay/

Footpaths / bike paths./

Speeding traffic./

I submit that the speed limit in estate 1 (and estate2) be set at 40km. All year round.

The impact is less than 1 minute duration 60km v 40km over the full distance of Canterbury Rd through the 1st Estate. Lees Rd to Lees Rd.

It is a trifling amount of time in return for the enhanced safety of all, particularly children, elderly, walkers, bike riders, pets, wildlife.

It will enhance the coastal village feel / value promoting a more relaxed environment.

Remove the 60/50 combinations and ambiguities (eg it depends which way you come in if you pass a 50 sign) As Venus Bay is not a "through" road the overall impact on through and local traffic is negligible.

I note with interest Page 42 where the report states that due to State Government directives some speed limits have increased. I would like to understand what these directives actually say and how they apply to a no through village / no main roads village such as Venus Bay (or Sandy Bay, etc). If busy Melbourne suburban high streets can be made 40km .. I cannot see why all the roads / lanes of VB cannot be the same.

Sure, some locals including permanents will need to have expectations managed.. However I suggest a campaign including a "slow-gan" such as "can you spare a minute for the kids?" will go a long way. Maybe a campaign icw the local community orgs.. Community House, men's shed, lifesaving club... Etc.

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



	We would like to make the following comments which may be incorporated or considered as part of the final plan.
	The Mobile Library is a truck and trailer combination of almost 19 metres in length. At Sandy Point the mobile parks in Beach Parade opposite the supermarket. Access to the parking spot during the peak holiday periods of Summer have been an issue for the service. Although the parking space for the mobile is signed with appropriate No Parking signs, on a number of occasions cars have been parked in the space reserved for the mobile. When this has happened the mobile has had to abandon service at Sandy Point and move on to Tarwin Lower.
	The mobile driver/operator does have an arrangement where witches hats and portable no parking signs are position by local residents before the mobile arrive to further identify the mobiles parking location. On occasion even this has not deterred visitors from parking between the portable signs and the permanent signs.
	The main point we wish to bring forward is that during peak holiday periods delivering the service expected by the local community is made difficult by the increase in vehicle traffic.

### The Draft - "Seasonal Population Impacts in South Gippsland Coastal Towns.

I'm a resident of Yanakie.

I would like to reply to the above draft report.

Part 3 Yanakie Town issue action plan – Yanakie page 81.

<u>Item 1</u> – I was surprised to read that you had omitted from your brief, in communicating to the general public that the Yanakie Recreation and Hall Reserve is situated on Crown Land, and is managed by a Committee of Management, appointed by the Minister.

If you had written this into the draft then you should have followed with – if you have any concerns about how this land is managed then write to the committee. This committee, to my knowledge has not received one letter about any issue raised in your report

It reads as if you have introduced another layer of authority (over-riding the current committee) for people to write to.

Question - Why has this happened?

<u>Item 2</u> - Some of the issues raised in your draft concerning Yanakie – Free Camping – Increased litter – Limiting resident's use of the hall and surrounds – Vehicles and Caravans blocking cattle run – Campfires – had all been addressed, in the past by an elected Hall Committee member, who unfortunately, has now left the area.

Let me explain – The current Hall Committee has just been appointed for 3 years – past committees excepted the overnight campers because the Hall received income from these people (It is written in the Government Gazette's that if the committee consents to the idea, then an nominal fee can be charged).

A metal box was made, and placed in concrete. This was called the donation box and people staying for the night could leave a donation. This money was happily accepted by all on the committee.

This committee member was happy to go to the hall at nights and supervise these people, and at the time, none of the issues in our report, were seen as an issue.

Another example was when we had our last election in South Gippsland. It was on a Saturday, and the night before I organised with an overnight visitor to ensure that people didn't block access to the hall as the hall was being used as a polling booth.

Well – next morning the area around the hall was left clear and all officials involved had a clearway to start the day.

It has been managed in the past, but nobody on the current committee wants to do the work like the past committee member.

The point is, it is up to the hall committee to manage these issues raised in your report, and you need to make this clear to the public and the hall.

The real problem (which you're overlooking) is that Yanakie has more overnight visitors than it can cater for and nobody wants to talk about it, and I don't know why.

<u>Item 3</u> – The Shire of South Gippsland, (Yanakie Caravan Park), Parks Victoria, (Tidal River camping ground) Shallow Inlet Caravan Park (privately owned), and the Shallow Inlet Foreshore Reserve (Committee of Management) are our only camping grounds within Yanakie.

What have you done to source information on how these business's manage their camping grounds, and what changes have they made that could have had an adverse effect on the camper who should be staying there? If you have this information, please, pass it on?

Remember – during our peak period all our camping grounds are full (Boxing Day through to the end of January) where do you suggest these people go?

That's the real problem not the spot fires that have been reported in your survey, think laterally – get these people back into our traditional camping grounds, and you fix the smaller issues.

My last question to you – please describe to me, what should a camping ground look like?

I trust you see the big issue and I look forward to your reply.

Thank you for your letter of 24<sup>th</sup> September 2015 enclosing a submission form in regard to the above.

I have now perused the draft plan and offer the following comments:

Car Parking and Beach Access:

Littering and Soiling of Dunes:

Dumping of Household/Domestic Rubbish in Litter Bins at Beach 5:

Public Toilets at Beaches 2 to 4:

Parks Victoria appears to be responsible for all these areas, and I regard them all as high priority.

- Would it be possible to provide more parking spaces along the access road to Beach 5, i.e. add
  considerably to the number of existing angle car parks at the side of the road leading to the
  main carpark? This would involve clearing a further section of bushland along the same side
  of the access road as is presently being used for car spaces.
- The rubbish bins at the carpark area at Beach 5 appear to have been dispensed with. I feel that rubbish bins for beach users are essential, and the action of removing them would seem to me to be counter-productive. There is a significant amount of rubbish (mostly plastic) being left on the beach by users even when bins are supplied, and the lack of them will exacerbate the problem. I have spoken by phone to the main office of Parks Victoria, who have informed me that removing rubbish bins from their areas of responsibility is not an overall blanket practice, but that each branch makes decisions regarding their own area. I have been unable to contact Parks Victoria's Foster branch which is apparently responsible for the Venus Bay area.
- Council's recent introduction of compulsory summer kerbside rubbish collection for holiday-house owners should alleviate the problem of holiday-house residents using the beach bins to the point of serious overflowing. Having said this however, it does raise problems for short-term residents i.e. matching their times of occupation to times of rubbish collection. Many bins, whether full or empty, will remain for lengthy periods in the street. (In my own case, we use our holiday house at Venus Bay for short periods ranging from a few days to a week at a time, with periods of 3 to 5 weeks in between visits. We have always carried our rubbish back to Melbourne for disposal and in most cases will probably continue to do so, in effect using Council's services very rarely.)
- Can a water tap, with appropriate drainage, be re-installed at the parking area of Beach 5? The
  water need not necessarily be suitable for drinking, although this would be preferable. If
  required, non-potable signs could be installed.

• I feel that public toilets should be provided at all Venus Bay beaches.

Lifesaving Club Capacity Limited to Beach 1:

It is unfortunate that the Venus Bay Surf Lifesaving Club has the capacity to patrol only Beach 1. Some years ago they were able to post an additional patrol on hot days at Beach 5. In view of the popularity of swimming at all the Venus Bay beaches, and the fact that it can be dangerous to swim at these beaches without the protection of lifesavers on duty, is it possible to hire professional lifeguards, perhaps with the financial aid of Council and/or the State Government? With the suggested warnings on Beaches 2 to 5 recommending that swimmers use Beach 1, the added pressure on Beach 1 will result in yet further parking problems and crowds at Beach 1. It is my opinion that this professional help should be sought, enabling not only an additional service at one of the other beaches (preferably one with toilets) but also an extension of lifesaving services at Beach 1 into the month of February during weekdays when the local Surf Lifesaving Club cannot provide a presence on the beach.

### Natural Environment:

Limiting the shell fishing for pipis between beaches 1 and 5 to certain hours of the day is a good move and would go a long way towards easing pressure on the possible over-fishing of pipis, and also to easing parking problems at the beaches. However I feel that the suggested hours of limitation should be extended to start at 8.00 a.m. and finish at 6.00 p.m. This decision is of course a responsibility of Fisheries Victoria. The re-installation of rubbish bins at the carparks would also encourage beach users to dispose of their rubbish appropriately and not leave it on the beach to pollute the environment.

In regard to all the other issues listed in the draft plan as Council's or other bodies' responsibilities, the suggested actions and priorities would appear to me to be appropriate.
